A Simple Journal Process

(example)

Date/Time: February 22, 2010

Passage: Mark 12:1-12

First Observations/Keywords: Vineyard, Son, God goes to any length caring for us. We don't accept easily.

Main idea/meaning: Jesus explained to the multitude how great God's love is and how they have rejected it time and time again. Jesus death is foreshadowed.

The passage makes me feel: a need to examine my own life to make sure that I am recognizing Jesus. The multitude rejected him even when they had him physically in their presence and saw many miracles. I wonder how often I push Jesus away.

I don't understand/questions: How can we be so selfish in the face of such overwhelming love.

Right now I believe God wants me to: Be a good steward of the gifts I have so that when his son returns he will find hospitality and faithfulness rather than hostility and contempt.

<u>Prayer:</u> God, forgive me for the times when I forget that you are the Master and I am the servant and that all I have is yours. May I be a great steward. May the Spirit keep me aware of your grace.

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
